



FAMILY CAMP FAQ

Will there be any volunteers or staff on the property?

There will be staff and volunteers on the property during your stay. Staff/volunteers will be leading program activities and fulfilling the behind-the-scenes needs of the program. During the program, parents/guardians are responsible for the actions, safety, and supervision of their children. No child is to be left unsupervised at any time.

Is Camp Good Days a smoke, tobacco and alcohol-free facility?

Yes, the use of smoking, vaping, and tobacco products are prohibited on the camp facility. No alcoholic beverages or controlled substances are allowed on the camp facility.

Is there a curfew during the family programs?

We ask all families to be in their cabins by midnight. 10:00 PM-7:00 AM is quiet hours in the Town of Jerusalem where Camp is located. Noise is expected to be at a minimum during these times. Children are not to be left unattended in the cabins.

Can we travel off-site during our camp session?

To best mitigate the potential spread of COVID-19, all participants must remain on the property during their session.

Are programs offered rain or shine?

Yes, programs are offered rain or shine.

Can we bring a family friend along?

Due to limited space, staffing, and COVID-19 safety protocols, we ask that only immediate family/members of the household attend. For families with only one parent/guardian, a support person may attend to assist with supervision.

Will there be open-swim during our stay?

Pool and waterfront activities will be scheduled. Swimming is permitted only while lifeguards are present and on duty.

Can we bring our family pet?

With the exception of certified service animals, family pets are not permitted on the facility.

Can we participate in activities with other families?

To ensure the safety of all participants, social distancing protocols (6 ft) and mask-wearing are to be followed for all activities. Please respect other families utilizing the same areas and abide by all rules, regulations, and posted signage.

Does the Camp have extra wheelchairs ?

Camp Good Days has extra wheel-chairs and motorized wheel-chairs available on property. Please let us know in your application how many your family needs.

Can we have visitors during our stay?

No visitors will be allowed during your stay. Anyone on Camp property will need to be a registered family camper.

What time are check-in and check-out?

Sunday-Tuesday Sessions

- Check-In: 3:00 PM
- Check-Out: 3:00 PM

Thursday-Saturday Sessions

- Check-In: 11:00 AM
- Check-Out: 11:00 AM



Can we check-in earlier than 11 AM or 3 PM?

Due to intensive cleaning and disinfecting procedures, we're unable to accommodate early check-ins.

What should we pack for our stay?

Please refer to the 'What to Bring' list posted on our website. We ask all participants to bring their own masks.

If my family qualifies for more than one program, can we attend more than one?

Unfortunately, our family camps are offered at a limited capacity. We encourage you to sign-up for the program which would best serve your family.

Will there be medical personnel on-site during our stay?

In the event of an emergency, our facility is located 8.9 miles away from Soldiers & Sailors Hospital in Penn Yan, NY. A registered Nurse may be on-site during your stay.
